

# A Recap of Friends of Wakulla Springs State Park News

Dear Julie,

Hope you've had joyous and peaceful holidays during the conclusion to the 2023 year and that the new chapter unfolding in 2024 is one of renewed spirit, goals and reinvigoration!

The following letter serves both as a recap of the Friends of Wakulla Springs State Park activities during 2023 and a forward glimpse into the upcoming new year 2024!

These last 12 months the Friends have been diligently working in front of, and behind, the scenes relating to Wakulla Springs protection, support and improvement efforts for the Park. I'll begin with the most significant news update concerning the jungle river boats, as they play a pivotal role in the immediate lifeblood and success of the Park. Next, the letter will cover the Friends chronological primary-focused activities that have occurred this last year, with a look ahead to 2024!

#### FRIENDS CAPITAL CAMPAIGN - BOATS RECAP & UPDATE

To recap last year; as part of the Friends initial Capital Campaign assessment process, a marine engineer "Cole & Associates" (from Panama City) evaluated each of the boats and provided us with their final inspection reports. FDEP also conducted an independent inspection (with "Yates") around the same time period. Both boat inspection report findings essentially had similar conclusions; that these vintage 50+ year old aluminum boats needed immediate attention

relating to upgrading and repairing the vessels and adhering to safety and maintenance standards and protocols.

During 2023, two beautiful boats, the "Monroe" and the 45 passenger "Eagle" were graciously provided to the Park from the good folks (Friends of Crystal River & Guest Services International, and Homosassa Springs), while the Park fleet was undergoing replacement(s). Although the scheduling was tight during this last year, the tours continued to be offered daily between 9 AM and 5 PM.

Over this last year, a vendor was selected (Trident Pontoon Boats, in Tavares FL) to replace the existing Park fleet (of four primary boats). Trident was able to complete and replace the existing boat fleet in record time during 2023, with the culmination of the last hybrid electric "Great Blue Heron" (generously donated by the Florida State Parks Foundation) being launched at a dedication ceremony held on November 17<sup>th</sup>. The boats are back in business, and tours will be continuing full throttle into this upcoming year! Reservations are available online and should be made before arriving at the park.

## FRIENDS ANNUAL MEETING 2023

The Friends annual meeting was held on a gorgeous day in the Terrace room of the Lodge on February 26<sup>th</sup>. Dr. Bill Stone presented his preliminary research activities during the last few weeks at Wakulla Springs. After a historical perspective of Dr. Stone's research, which has taken place at the Park with Wakulla 1 in 1987 and again in 1998 with Wakulla 2, we were treated to the initial 3D+ renderings of their most recent Wakulla 3 excursion at Sally Ward Spring. The researchers expect to return to Wakulla Springs in less than a year for ongoing research...we will keep you posted!

On March 25<sup>th</sup>, the Friends and Park hosted two tables at the March 25<sup>th</sup> TCC (now TSC) History Festival in Kleman Plaza including a 3D Showing of the "Creature from the Black Lagoon". The public was out in droves that day, and the 3D movie (at the Challenger Center) was shown to a packed theater!

## **RIVERS BENEATH US**

On April 25<sup>th</sup>, the Friends hosted the first in a series of Educational Environmental Forums entitled "Rivers Beneath Us" held at the Wakulla Environmental Institute. Two hydrogeologists; Tom Greenhalgh and Dr. Chris Werner, and a research economist, Jad Kabbani, presented on the current physiology and economic conditions of the Wakulla Spring cave system.

#### ENVIRONMENTAL LEARNING WORKSHOP

On April 29<sup>th</sup>, the Environmental Learning and Communication Workshop was held at the Park, and co-sponsored by the Friends and FSU. The workshop was led by an interdisciplinary team of experts from FSU who shared their knowledge and expertise on microlearning, water testing and participatory GIS. Each component was designed to engage attendees and provide them with practical skills and knowledge. The second part of the workshop was Friends Board member Dr. Ming Ye's presentation on water testing, and Mike Core's lecture on participatory GIS focusing on how GIS and maps can be used to tell a story, communicate risk, share information, and make a difference in a community.

Two GIS apps, QuickCapture and Survey123 were introduced, and attendees were shown how to use them. The session provided users with a hands-on opportunity to learn about water quality in environmental communication and learning, and the significance of using GIS and maps to communicate environmental risks and issues.

#### **ADVOCACY**

During Spring and early Summer, the Friends continued to be involved in contributing evidence-based research information, and advocacy, at Wakulla County Commission meetings and through numerous letters supporting cave and springs protection relating to siting a proposed gas station (owned by SW Oil and Gas) directly above the Chip's Hole cave system, thereby feeding directly into Wakulla Springs. Ultimately, it was decided that the project would not move forward but the land would be purchased through a conservation program (e.g., FL Forever, Conservation FL, etc.).

## PLAYGROUND & FAREWELL

The summer was also a bittersweet time for the Friends and Park staff. The Park Manager, Amy Conyers, was suddenly relieved of service, which was a difficult time for everyone, as it was most unexpected. On August 11<sup>th</sup>, we held both a playground construction day, followed by a going away party event on her behalf. Amy was instrumental in working with the Florida State Parks Foundation, Duke Energy, and the Friends, in securing funding for this ADA-playground project, among so many other attributes over the years. We wanted to honor her for her years of service to the Park, her stellar partnership with the Friends, and for the playground's completion.

A new Park Manager was hired. Lance Kelly began his job in late September. Lance was the former "GeoParks" (overseeing eight local State Parks) Park Manager, and had previously served as a Park Ranger at Wakulla Springs State Park. We are so fortunate that Lance has stepped into this new role as it's been a very seamless and smooth process, not only for himself, but for us (Park and Friends) as well. Lance has also hit the ground running with respect to upcoming projects and collaborative ideas/projects; we look forward to working with him, and will have more news to report this upcoming year!

## **TRUNK or TREAT**

On October 28<sup>th</sup> we held a double-header event: the first "Trunk or Treat" event (at noon) followed by the "Creature Feature" event in the evening. The Friends had recently purchased a beautiful movie projection screen for this, and future movie-sharing events. This year, the Park, Capital City Video Lounge and the Friends partnered to provide three movies: 1) Creature from the Black Lagoon 2) Return of the Creature from the Black Lagoon, and; 3) Frogs (filmed locally). The weather was perfect, with a full moon peering through the trees, and about 400 people in attendance. The Lodge provided delicious Black Lagoon-themed food & drinks. The menu will definitely be expanded next time!

#### **ERNEST TOOLE EVENT**

On December 9<sup>th</sup>, the Friends held an event to honor Ernest Toole, a talented local musician, who has been performing and advocating on behalf of Springs protection, and for the Friends of Wakulla Springs for too many years to count. The event was deftly spearheaded by Board member Ken Beattie. It was a well-attended event, and both Ernest and his granddaughter Sarah, received awards/framed certificates for their prized years of dedicated service to the community – they are so well deserving!

# **GENERAL 2023 UPDATES**

## WATER SAMPLING PROGRAM

The regional water sampling program the Friends are involved in, with the University of Florida's Dr. John Bowden (Dept. of Physiological Sciences & Veterinary Sciences), has evolved into an ongoing partnership. We continue to be in communication with Dr. Bowden and providing letters of support for ongoing and future water quality research activities, but still haven't received our water sampling (for Per- and Polyfluoralkyl Substances, or PFAS) results for the Wakulla area's 30+ sites). It's hoped all will be ready for website viewability in 2024!

## **ELEVATOR/WINDOWS GRANT UPDATE**

The grant project team has continued to meet over 2023. Although the Architectural and Engineering Services (A&E) portion of the project had to be rebid (in early 2023) according to Florida Division of Historical Resources bid guidelines/procedures, the lowest bid came from the firm that was on our original proposal. MLD Architects have been very professional to work with this last year. They've completed their progress reports (100%) and we were able to hold a pre-bid conference in early December. We have one interested vendor (who has the prerequisite historical construction & restoration expertise) and we'll have the final bid opening on January 5th. Once the construction prime contractor is hired (hopefully in January), we'll be able to start the restoration work at the Lodge; including the chimneys, windows, fire escapes, drainage issues, and a few other items.

## DONATION OF \$3,500 FROM ECOSYSTEM CONSERVATION SOCIETY - JAPAN
